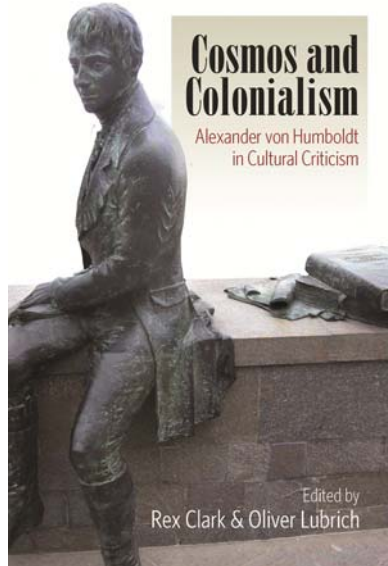


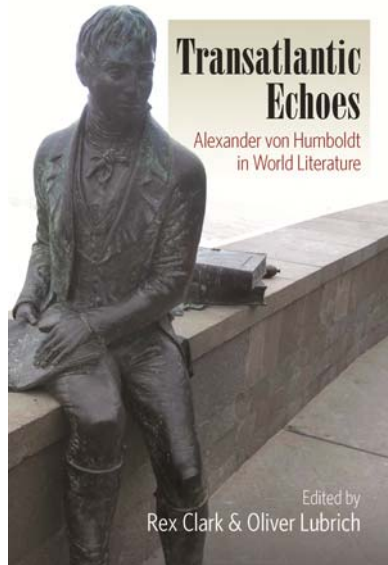
Berghahn Books is pleased to announce the recent publication of two volumes on Alexander von Humboldt, both edited by **Rex Clark and Oliver Lubrich**.
